

Study Abroad in Ireland 2020



Objective:

The main objective is to give Irish language students the opportunity to speak with native-speakers of the vernacular, to develop their conversational and idiomatic command of the language, and to experience the richness of Irish Gaelic culture as a living tradition.

Course Curriculum:

The curriculum offers two accredited courses: Intermediate Irish 1 for learners with a minimum of two semesters of instruction in Irish; and Intermediate Irish 2 for students who have a minimum of four semesters of instruction in the language. Both courses are designed to maximize the possibilities of student interaction with the community of native-speakers in the area and to provide as much exposure as possible to the cultural, historical and geographical beauty of Ireland. The courses have a number of core elements: Morning class work; guest-speaker program; guided trips to places of historical and cultural interest; and social and cultural activities in the evening.

Credits: The courses are four credit courses and are open to traditional and non-traditional students.

Dates: May 09 to May 30. Students depart USA on Saturday, May 09 and return on Saturday, May 30.

Cost: \$2300. A non-refundable deposit of \$300 must be paid by Friday, April 3.

This price covers tuition, accommodation, transport as well as ferry and admission costs to places of cultural and historic interest. The price quoted does not include flights, food or other living expenses.

Accommodation:

Students will be housed in fully furnished, self-catering holiday homes at Na Cluainte, in Ballyferriter village. These homes are of the highest standards and have all modern conveniences and appliances.

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
