FULBRIGHT OPPORTUNITY IN INNOVATION

ELIGIBILITY

- Must be an Irish citizen, or E.U. citizen living in Ireland for the last 3+ years
- Must be a current or prospective postgraduate student with a minimum 2.1 or a current postdoctorate with a recent PhD conferral (within the past 3 years)
- Must have a clear course of study
- Leadership qualities and/or potential essential
- Must have a clear understanding of what it means to be a Fulbrighter
- Must *not* be a dual U.S.-Irish citizen, green card holder, or currently living in the U.S. or already have extensive experience of studying or living in the U.S.

FUNDING DETAILS

- Monetary grant, plus accident and emergency insurance, cultural and professional programming, and J-1 visa administration
- Student applicants can do a full PhD or Masters in the U.S. or portion of an ongoing Irish postgraduate degree, but will need to seek funding for subsequent years

ANYTHING ELSE YOU SHOULD KNOW?

All successful applicants must comply with the two-year home rule, which means that awardees will not be eligible for U.S. residency or a visa until the two-year home rule in Ireland is complete.

Preference will be given to visiting researchers.
