## **FULBRIGHT OPPORTUNITY IN GEOSCIENCE**

### **ELIGIBILITY**

- Must be an Irish Citizen, or E.U. citizen living in the Republic of Ireland for the last 3+ years
- Must be a current postgraduate student, current postdoctoral scholar, active researcher or a professional with 5 years relevant experience
- Must have a clear course of study in Geoscience or a relevant field
- Leadership qualities and potential are essential
- Must have a clear understanding of what it means to be a Fulbrighter
- Must not be a dual U.S.-Irish citizen, green card holder, or currently living in the U.S., or have extensive experience of studying or living in the U.S.

#### **FUNDING DETAILS**

- Monetary grant, plus accident and emergency insurance, cultural and professional programming, and J-1 visa administration
- Student applicants can do a full PhD or Masters in the U.S. or portion of an ongoing Irish postgraduate degree, but will need to seek additional funding for subsequent years

#### **ANYTHING ELSE YOU SHOULD KNOW?**

All successful applicants must comply with the two-year home rule, which means that awardees will not be eligible for U.S. residency or a visa until the two-year home rule in Ireland is complete. Preference will be given to visiting researchers.
