ELIGIBILITY

- An Irish or E.U. citizen who has lived in the Republic of Ireland for three or more years
- Prospective postgraduate student with a minimum 2.1 undergraduate degree in law and a clear course of study
- Leadership qualities and potential, as well as a clear understanding of what it means to be a Fulbrighter
- Is not a dual U.S.-Irish citizen, green card holder, or currently living in the U.S.
- Does not already have extensive experience of studying or living in the U.S.

If you meet the criteria, please email awards@fulbright.ie stating: Your full name, area of study, and where you intend to research or study (IU Maurer School of Law)

We will then issue you the link to the online application system (known as Embark) and the guidelines. All applications are due by 4 p.m. (EST) on Friday, October 28, 2016. You must also apply to, and be accepted at, the Maurer Law. Application instructions are available at:

FUNDING DETAILS

- A \$25,000 grant from Indiana University for its LL.M. program (approximately 50% tuition). You must be able to complete the entire length of the L.LM. program
- Monetary grant from the Fulbright Commission, plus accident and emergency insurance, cultural and professional programming, and J-1 visa administration from the Fulbright Program

All successful applicants must comply with two-year home rule, which means that awardees will not be eligible for U.S. residency or a visa until the two-year home rule in Ireland is complete. The successful candidate will be responsible for the remaining tuition and fees.
