FULBRIGHT TECHIMPACT OPPORTUNITY

ELIGIBILITY

- Must be an Irish Citizen, or an E.U. citizen who has lived in the Republic of Ireland for 3+ years
- Preference will be given to a Professional with 3-5 years' experience in relevant fields or early career researchers with PhD conferred since 2014
- Must have a clear research proposal that demonstrates the pivotal importance of a Fulbright TechImpact Award at this career stage, expected outcomes / impact and an affiliation with a recognized educational institution, research institute, cultural organization, or other approved nonacademic institution
- Leadership qualities and potential are essential
- Must have a clear understanding of what it means to be a Fulbrighter
- Must *not* be a dual U.S.-Irish citizen, green card holder, or currently living in the U.S. and must *not* already have extensive experience of studying or living in the U.S.

HOW TO APPLY?

If you meet the above criteria, please email <u>awards@fulbright.ie</u> stating:

- Your full name as it appears on your passport
- Area of research
- Home Institution
- Where you intend to research
- How long you intend to be in the U.S. The allowable period is 2 weeks and up to 3 months between July 2019–August 2020. The possibility of repeat visits that do not aggregate to more than three months may be considered provided there is a robust justification and program of work for return visits.

ANYTHING ELSE YOU SHOULD KNOW?

All successful applicants must comply with the two-year home rule, which means that awardees will not be eligible for U.S. residency or a visa until the two-year home rule is complete.
