FULBRIGHT OPPORTUNITY IN ENVIRONMENTAL STUDIES

ELIGIBILITY

- Must be an Irish Citizen, or an E.U. citizen who has lived in the ROI for the last 3+ years
- Must be a current or prospective postgraduate student with a minimum 2.1, a current post doctorate, or a professional with 5 years relevant experience
- Must have a clear course of study
- Leadership qualities and potential are essential
- Must have a clear understanding of what it means to be a Fulbrighter
- Must *not* be a dual U.S.-Irish citizen, green card holder, or currently living in the U.S. or already have extensive experience of studying or living in the U.S.

FUNDING DETAILS

- Monetary grant, plus accident and emergency insurance, cultural and professional programming, & J-1 visa administration
- Student applicants can do a full PhD or Master's in the U.S. or a portion of an ongoing Irish postgraduate degree but will need to seek additional funding for subsequent years

ANYTHING ELSE YOU SHOULD KNOW?

All successful applicants must comply with the two-year home rule, which means that awardees will not be eligible for U.S. residency or a visa until the two-year home rule in Ireland is complete.

Preference will be given to visiting researchers.
